Christmas Eve Service

And I remember setting my bulletin on fire (yes, true story). The Christmas Eve service holds fond memories for me. You need to know that this decision was made with much prayer and discussion among the Elders of our church.

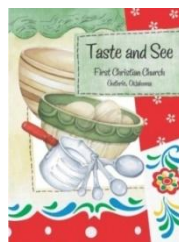
But ultimately, we feel that this change will be better for the church in the long run. The late night service numbers have been steadily and consistently dwindling. We are concerned about the safety of our more mature members. And we saw more of our families and adults attending the earlier service that was meant specifically for children. Keeping all of that in mind we decided a multigenerational service at an earlier time and a late scaled back service would be the best.

We felt that offering the two new services and times would help meet the needs of the church in a better way. We do not hold on to tradition for the sake of tradition anymore than we change for the sake of change. We grow and evolve as people of faith and as a church because we follow the Spirit and it's leading to the best of our ability.

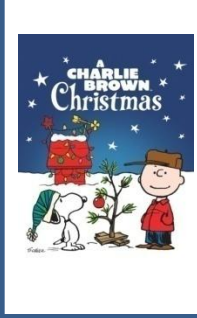
Adopt a child for Christmas! Stockings due Dec. 9



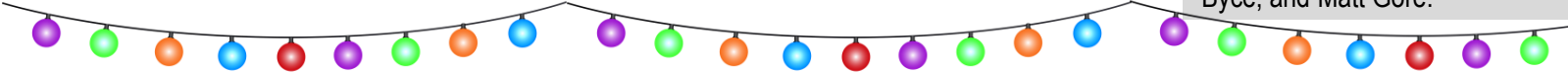
