Christian Outreach Needs Your Help

Christian Outreach is busy working on their initiatives for 2021 and one of those involves assessing the assistance programs and facilities available in Guthrie to help those in need throughout out our community. By doing this, we hope to get a better grasp on how our church can better meet needs and not overlap when it comes to promoting programs and debuting ministry opportunities within our church.

Our first step is creating a list of places who offer assistance and then creating a common list of questions we would like those places to answer. This is not a small task, so we need your help!

We need 3-4 people who have daytime hours available to make calls to a few of these places. When you call you will ask if they would be willing to fill out our pre-written survey. The Christian Outreach team has the survey put together, a script written for when you call these places and the contact info for each place. We just need a few willing people to help out. Examples of places you would be calling include: the youth shelter, God's Food Bank, Lunch on Noble, the Red Cross, etc.

We are planning to have a zoom call on Thursday at 6 p.m. to go over how to approach the calls and divide up the 11 places we will be calling in the first round. Right now, there are already three people willing to help, so the more people we have helping the fewer places you would have to call.

KID'S WORSHIP

Jesus Tempted in the Wilderness (Luke 4:1-13)

In Kid's Worship this week, we talked about when Jesus was tempted in the wilderness. We talked about each of the three different times he was tempted to sin but each time, he relied on scripture to resist the temptation. We talked about how if we study and memorize scripture, it can help us if we are ever tempted to not do the right thing too. We had to make it all the way through our lesson staring at a very tempting jar of M&Ms, but luckily we resisted the temptation to eat them too early and waited until the end of our time together to enjoy a small treat!

This week: Talk to your kids about a time that you have been tempted to do the wrong thing because it may have been easier than following the path God had for you. Discuss how you relied on scripture and God's plan to resist that specific temptation.

Pray with your family: Dear God, We know that we will go through times when we are tempted to take the easy way out or to do something we know we are not supposed to do. Please help us remember that when these times happen, we are to lean on Your Word for guidance and direction and resist that temptation just as Jesus did. Amen.

- Specific guidelines for engaging with community members.




Chili Cook-off
