Easter is coming!

With that, we are already making plans for Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter). This year, we are wanting to do a Seder Meal on Thursday (commonly known as Maundy Thursday or Holy Thursday). The word Maundy comes from the Latin, "Mandatum," or "command" which refers to the instructions Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Supper.

The Seder Meal will be at 6 p.m. on Thursday, April 14 at the church. A Seder Meal is a remembrance of the type of meal that would have been shared around the tables as part of the Passover celebration. The ceremony includes reading, drinking wine (grape juice), telling stories, singing and eating special foods such as Matzah ball soup, parsley,

hard-boiled eggs, herbs, charoses (nuts, apples, cinnamon) and maror (lettuce, horseradish, onion, celery). The food is eaten throughout the readings and the significance of each is

Because this meal will take some preparation, we are requiring reservations to be made by Sunday, April 3. This ceremony would be appropriate for the entire family, however, we will have a nursery available for those 3 years and younger.

Easter is coming!

I can't believe it's only a few weeks away. I hope your Lent is going well and that you have added in some things that are improving your relationship with God and others. I hope you have eliminated some distractions that have resulted in improving your vision and overall well-being.

I am enjoying reading along with about 25-30 of you on our YouVersion studies. We have made it midway through Exodus and read about Pharoah, Moses and Aaron, the Israelites plight to get out of Egypt, the Plagues, the Passover, the parting of the Red Sea, the 10 Commandments and the journey to Mount Sinai. We've covered a lot of ground...literally!

Those who have been reading the shorter studies have focused on being "uncommon," "the heart of God," "temptation," "following Jesus" and this week, we are looking at prayer. I enjoy everyone's comments as we study together. It is always interesting what different people take away from different scriptures. I think that's the fascination of doing Bible Study; it meets you right where you are at different points in life. While some of it is very historical in nature, telling how events unfolded, a large portion of it allows for life application.

This past Wednesday, we had a Pastor's Class with 10 of our 4th-6th graders. We always ask them why they are in the class and what they hope to learn. Most of them say they are interested in baptism, a few will say because their parents told them to come (ha ha), and others will say to learn more about the Bible. We always give opportunities to write down questions that can be answered in the next session. In Wednesday's class, we had four questions turned in and they were all the same "What is heaven like?" I thought it was interesting that they all focused on the same thing. I think it's human nature to wonder what's next! I know there are days when I wonder "What is heaven like?" I feel like there are days when we could all use a little heaven on earth.

When I think about Easter coming and the hope that it brings, I can't help but think about Jesus' command to "love one another" and to "go and make disciples." I feel like these go hand-in-hand. If we truly "love one another" the most loving thing is to invite people into a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Over the past year, we have been so blessed with many visitors in worship and at other events. It is a joy to meet new people and to hear what has brought them into the church. I love hearing about the things they are excited about and what things bring them joy. I feel like with each new person who attends, God is weaving together a beautiful tapestry. Each of us play a part in what happens whether serving on a Sunday at FCC or when we are out and about each week. We always have an opportunity to "Share Christ and Grow in Faith" wherever we are!

As we think about "What is heaven like?" I hope you will also think about those who don't even consider that question. Invite them to come join us and see what a life in Christ has to offer. One of the concepts we teach in Pastor's Class is that accepting Christ in our life is a personal decision. I can't make that decision for you and you can't make that decision for me. It is a one-on-one decision between you and Jesus. However, what we can do is encourage one another and spur one another on to explore and deepen our desire for Christ. So, I will end with this question — who do you need to invite and encourage? Who needs to experience the question "What is heaven like?" It's a great time to share your faith and explain how it has changed your life.
