


Capital Campaign

September has been busy in the children's department of FCC! We've had a full month of Kidventure Wednesdays! We have been averaging about 55 kids in attendance each week as we learn some real messy truths from the Bible together. So far we have learned that God tells us there is a time and a season for everything; too much "yum" can easily turn into a "yuck" if we don't pay attention to God's timing. We've also learned that God's grace is always enough, and this week we will be fixing our eyes on Jesus while learning about perseverance. We've also chowed down on too much chocolate pudding to find a worm, shot kool-aid blasters at targets, raced with macaroni noodles, and all kinds of other activities to help us remember these Bible truths. We're just at the halfway mark of the fall Kidventure session and are excited for the next few weeks of activities! Keeping Up With Karen

This past month so many have been intrigued by the events of Queen Elizabeth II's death. Last Monday, as I watched the service I continued to be amazed at how loved she was and how an entire country was so reverent to the position she held and how she lived with grace yet attained such a high position. As I was driving to work that morning, I heard a list of reasons we respected the Queen read "on air" on the radio. Each one seemed to represent a life well lived and one that found balance. It made me wonder if I would have responded the way she did to a life that was more or less chosen for her. I found the list online later that day and thought it was interesting to share.

Reasons we respected the Queen:

- 1. She submitted to something bigger than herself for the good of others.
- 2. She was not controlled by her emotions.
- 3. She lived a quiet life, and could have but didn't draw extra attention to herself.
- 4. Her identity seemed secure despite constant global spotlight and criticism.
- 5. She was slow to speak and thoughtful with every word.
- 6. She was wholeheartedly committed to her marriage and family.
- 7. She regularly displayed courage and wisdom in unthinkable circumstances.
- 8. She saw her life as service.

May we be more like her and may we notice the older generations around us that are living faithful quiet lives and honor them as well.

While the culture in the United Kingdom and other commonwealths is very different from ours, I have no doubt that the qualities she portrayed are some that all of us would like to replicate given almost any circumstance. I have no doubt that she had her off-camera moments and wasn't perfect but to constantly be under the spotlight and microscope bears with it a pressure that many of us would not handle with such consistency.

In many ways, as I looked at the traits that were listed, I heard parallels to scripture and how Jesus called us to live. He asks us to live servant lives, to be slow to anger, slow to speak and quick to love. He called us to put other's interests before our own. He called us to find grace before judgement. I pray that as my faith continues to grow, that I will work harder at these attributes, knowing that others who may not know Christ will be drawn closer to him because of my responses in life. Just some food for thought this week!

Fall is here (even if it doesn't always feel like it) and we have a full slate of fun ahead. We had our All-Church Picnic on Sunday. In October, we will celebrate World Communion Sunday on Oct. 2, with a focus on communion by intinction (coming forward) and being reminded of how we are all one body in Christ. 
