That's a wrap on our fall session of Kidventure! We spent 6 fun weeks together learning very messy truths from the Bible. On our first week of Kidventure, the kids played all kinds of water games and got to know each other. For WWeek 2 we learned too much yum can become a yuck with a lesson based on Ecclesiastes 3:1 - There is a time for everything, a time for every activity under heaven. On Week 3, we heard more about God's grace based on the verse in 2 Corinthians 12:9 - But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. Week 4 brought us a lesson in perseverance from Hebrews 12:1-2 "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." Our games for Week 4 helped us to remember to keep our eyes focused on Jesus and to never give up. Week 5 was all about the power of our words, coming from Psalms 19:14 - "May the words of my mouth and the thoughts of my heart be pleasing to you, Oh LORD, my rock and my redeemer." We were quickly reminded with our games that we cannot easily take back words that have already been said because our words have power! And then we wrapped up Week 6 together with some large group games. Special thanks to our adult and youth volunteers who helped make Kidventure happen in so many ways! ## Keeping Up With <br> Karen

What an amazing event we had Sunday evening with the "Live Like You're Dying" Seminar! We had about 65 in attendance and an amazing panel of speakers who answered questions for more than an hour about everything from wills and trusts, to organ donation, long-term care, hospice and everything in between. I just finished reading the surveys and across the board the event had glowing reviews but even more exciting was that 80 percent of the surveys said they wish it had last longer (it was a 2 -hour event). Rarely do you hear that about events these days, so I take that as a good indicator that the information being shared was helpful.
I am already getting lots of questions about a follow-up event or hosting it again, so I'm sure it will get on the radar again sometime for those who missed it. As I said again and again at the seminar, it's never too early to plan for end-of-life decisions. Ronnie always says that the chances of dying are one-to-one and he's right! We never know what tomorrow will bring but we can make decisions now that will make that moment so much easier for our children, brothers, sisters, parents, grandparents, friends and others who may have to make decisions on our behalf. One of the best gifts we can give our loved ones is a plan and for them to know our wishes.
So, even if you weren't able to attend the seminar, I will pose the following questions to you and hope you will consider action on some of them.

- How have you prepared your estate/finances so that others will be directed how to handle things in the event of your death? (Even if you don't have a lot of money, you still have something that will have to be dealt with.)
- Do you have a will or trust?
- Have you done an Advanced Directive or DNR so if you were to become incapacitated or on life support, your loved ones would know your wishes?
- Would you want to live in a nursing home or to ever be put on hospice?
- Do you have a cemetery plot, an idea of what you would want for your funeral as far as casket or cremation, full memorial service or graveside? Do you have a monument?
- What would you like at your memorial service? Do you have a favorite scripture, songs, poems and have your written out your obituary? Have you told someone where all of this is stored so it will be easy to access?
- If you are single, is someone else on the titles to your car, home, bank accounts, safety deposit boxes etc. or are you willing for the courts/lawyers to soak up your life savings sorting out your estate?
- Does someone you trust know the password to your cell phone, e-mail or any life insurance policies that might be needed when you die?
- Is there a list of relatives and friends who you would want contacted and their current contact information, so news about your services/death could be shared?
- Do you know your mother's maiden name and your grandmother's maiden name? Often times at the funeral home you will need this information for death certificates and if you have a complicated past you may need to research this information to make those questions easier for your family to answer.

There is a myriad of questions that could be added but if you are able to start tackling each of these, rest assured it will be a wonderful gift to your family. I know nobody ever wants to sit and talk about their own death but it certainly will give you peace of mind to know that the decisions are made and they are made in a time of rational thought, rather than crisis mode.
