

Are You Ready to Embrace the Power of Gratitude This November? As we journey through the month of November, the season of Thanksgiving causes me to reflect on the many blessings in my life. I hope you will as well. Have you ever stopped to consider the profound impact that gratitude can have on you?

According to several studies I found, gratitude plays a pivotal role in enhancing our mental and physical health.

Regular gratitude journaling can lead to a 5% to 15% increase in optimism and a 25% improvement in sleep quality. A staggering 90% of American teens and adults reported that expressing gratitude made them feel "extremely happy" or "somewhat happy." Just a five-minute daily gratitude journal can boost long-term well-being by 10%.

Maybe this is why the Bible constantly reminds us to be thankful. Like in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

As we approach Thanksgiving, let's make a conscious effort to cultivate a heart of gratitude. Let's cherish the moments, big and small, and recognize the countless blessings that enrich our lives. After all, in the act of giving thanks, we not only uplift our spirits but also bring joy and hope to those around us.

I hope if you were in church on Sunday you grabbed a "Count Me In!" magnet. We are so excited to kick off our Fall Stewardship Campaign. Ronnie's sermon hit the five points we will be focusing on but the bottom line is we want YOU to be an active part of FCC's ministries. Even if you feel like you can't do much because of time or limited physical ability, I promise you can do something! It takes all of us to make a difference.

This past year, so many new and exciting things have taken place and it only happens because people are following God's nudging and serving Him.

This past weekend was a prime example as we had a new ministry kick-off on Friday. A team of four people delivered cookies to our homebound or those who just needed a "bright spot" in their day. This ministry came to fruition because several people saw how much of a difference it made when they delivered cookies and called on people during Mission Sunday in July. A big thank you to Annette Keller, Bonita Johnston, Sharyl Padgett, Gene and Diann Owen for being willing to step up and lead this ministry.

Also on Sunday, the men gathered for breakfast and to hear Damon Devereaux speak about his walk of faith. The Men's breakfast was created by Wayne Elder and several men jumped on board to help cook and serve. We had more than 40 men attend! That's incredible!

There are a few other ministries that have been created or gained ground this past year as well. We have an online Bible Study that meets on Mondays (it is meeting on Tuesday this week). It is led by Stephanie Tucker and has been fantastic. The church Facebook page lists the link to join each week (typically posted on Sunday/Monday). Also, we have several age-appropriate groups meeting monthly. The 20-something group meets every other week and goes to restaurants, fun activities and are doing a book study (Messy Spirituality). Currently, Ronnie is leading this group. There is also a group for the 30's-50's somethings. They meet quarterly and Wayne Elder has been instrumental in getting that group rolling. The Retired Fellowship Group has become active again this year with dinner and a movie, Bingo with the Thunder, a trip to the Botanical Gardens, a visit to Ladybug Lane to pick flowers, and a visit to the Pioneer Woman. Karen Allen leads this group and is making plans for a Christmas lights trip in December. We also have seven active dinner groups with various leaders for each group. These groups meet from Jan.-March, May-July, Sept.-Nov. We will be reorganizing groups in December for the new year and hope you will join one. Some groups meet in restaurants, others meet in homes and one group meets at the church for a potluck. Also, new to FCC are 1st Sunday's Fellowship meal. The next one is Nov. 5. In worship, hopefully if you love singing you have helped "fill the choir loft" on the first Sunday of the month.

Those are just a few of the things that are new in 2023 and it's all because people have stepped up and wanted to be involved. I truly hope that in addition to making worship a priority, you will make getting involved in the life of the church and inviting others to join us a big priority for 2024 and you are saying "Count Me In!"

Also, I want to mention the importance of financial giving. We know that money is a difficult topic to discuss but Jesus called us to be faithful with our finances. As a church, we have been so blessed this past year with faithful giving and it has allowed us to do ministry in so many ways. I ask that you prayerfully consider what you can do financially as part of the church. Scriptures: Moses Sees God's Glory: Exodus 33:7-23; Matthew 11:25-30; Main point: We can turn to God when we need rest.

ARE WE THERE YET? We've been learning about the Israelites in the desert on the way to the Promised Land. They had been wandering around in the desert for so long. They must have gotten so tired. They probably asked, "Are we there yet?" so many times, but the answer was still no!

Have you ever felt overwhelmed by something and felt like you needed a break? When I feel overwhelmed, one of the most helpful things for me to do is rest - and you thought naps were only for babies! What are some of your favorite ways to rest? No, fall break doesn't count
O Do you... Exercise. Sing. Take a nap. Watch a show or movie. Breathe. Read a book. Go for a walk. Write in a journal. Draw or paint ... (And if you don't do any of these things, what would you most want to try?)

PRAYER: God, you always know what's best for us. That's why you invite us to slow down and rest. We know that true rest comes from you. Help us to pause to take care of ourselves and to make time to talk with you. Amen.

•How did the people know when Moses was with God? A cloud would cover the opening of the tent.

•When might you need to rest? Why do we need to ask God for rest? •Where can you go to spend quiet time with God?


