

Keeping Up With Karen



Authentic — when you think of that word, what comes to mind? This morning, I was reading a story about the Merriam-Webster Dictionary's "Word of the Year" for 2023. The decision for the "Word of the Year" is partially based on the number of times people do online "word searches" for a certain word throughout the previous year. The dictionary defines "authentic" as "not false or imitation" and "true to one's own personality, spirit, or character" and a synonym of "real" and "actual." It is suspected that the rise in the search of the word "authentic" is due to Artificial Intelligence (AI) and social media searches that cause people to wonder if what they are seeing is true or real. The word "deepfakes" was a close second. "Deepfakes" are images and videos that appear real but are generated by Al.

It was intriguing to learn that "authentic" is what has been on people's radar throughout the last year. I couldn't help but immediately think of how this is so relevant to what we should be doing as a church. Our world is full of things that try to distract or cause us to lose focus on being Christians. I feel like so many people are seeking what is truthful, authentic and real. I can't think of a more relevant time to share the news of Jesus Christ — a message that is full of truth, authenticity and is real. As scripture says "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." (Hebrew 13:8)


As we enter the Christmas season, I hope that you will reflect on how authentic your reflection of Christ is and are your actions and words drawing others closer to Christ? Whether we are being a keyboard warrior and commenting online or just walking through the grocery store or downtown Guthrie, does our spirit or actions line up with the One we serve. I often find myself asking "what would Jesus do" and more often than not, these days I find myself asking "what would Jesus say" or "not say." Our faith calls us to use words that are less harsh, to have actions that are servant-driven, and to notice the unnoticed.

This Christmas, I pray that we will take time to be "authentic" in how we are sharing the Christmas story. I pray that we can be a light to others and lead people to the manger where they will find the unexpected, unending love of a God who was willing to send His only Son to save us.

We have so many opportunities to be a part of giving and sharing throughout the Advent season. The newsletter is full of activities and what I would encourage you to do is to find the things that will bring you and your family joy as well as the things that will allow you to bless others. One of the sayings we focus on as a church staff is "full hearts, not full calendars." I hope you are feeling that as you look through the events at church and find what fills your heart!

This Advent season we will be asking for your help as we light the candles each week during worship. Instead of the traditional readings, each week we will be posting and e-mailing out a question that is reflective of the candle we will be lighting on Sunday. For example, this week's candle focuses on **Hope!** We will ask you to reflect on "What does Hope mean to you?" We will read some of the responses during the lighting of the Advent Candle during worship and reflect on how hope is seen in the world today and what scripture says about hope. Please take a minute to respond to these questions and spend some time reflecting on each week's candle.

I pray you have a wonderful Advent season and in doing so are reminded of what it means to be "authentic" in sharing the greatest story ever — "Today, in the town of David, a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." (Luke 2:11-12)

Toshua 5:13–6:25; Psalm 100

Welcome to the final lap of the Promised Land Grand Prix! Will the Israelites win and take the land as their grand prize? Let's see if they stay On the Right Track to victory! Ready, set, go!

If you want to race into this story, try these questions...

- •What did God tell Joshua to do in order to defeat Jericho? (March around the city for six days with seven priests carrying trumpets. On the seventh day, march around the city seven times.)
- •Who was the only family saved from Jericho? Why? (Rahab's, because she had faith in God and helped the Israelite spies in the past.)
- Why do you think God told the people to walk around the city for seven days? (To show obedience to God.)
- •Read Psalm 100:5. What does this verse tell us about how long we can have victory with God? (Forever!)
- •What are some things this psalm invites us to do? (Shout for joy, worship, sing, and give thanks. These are all things we might do when we are celebrating a big win, for example.)

PIT STOP (Weekly challenge): Every racer needs to take a pit stop to stop and refuel. Ask yourself: Everyone loves to win. **Is winning the same as a victory?**

- •Almost... when you win, you get first place and come home with a prize. But if you want victory, you can win even if you don't get first place because victory is about finishing well, being a good sport, and staying true to the person God made you to be. As followers of God, we can always have victory!
- •What are some small wins you've had recently?
- •What was a time that a loss was actually a victory for you?

PRAYER: God, thank you for giving us victory! We understand that having victory doesn't always mean we will win, but we know that is not as important as knowing you and obeying you. Help us to have the kinds of victories that matter most because we trust you know what is best for us. Amen


