#### The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. John 1:9

When you think of Christmas, what are the first things that come into your mind? During Youth Extra we shared a few... It is true that those are all wonderful things that remind us of this season. And sometimes, all of the stuff overshadows what's most important ... the only reason we have Christmas at all! Together we read the Christmas story, a story many have heard but díd you know:

#### • Let's start from the beginning, with Luke 2:1-5, shall we?

• In today's time, a census is a much quicker process that is useful to make sure all people are being represented in the government and that there are enough resources available. But a census back then was mostly just for the ruling emperor's bragging rights. They just wanted to know how big their empire was, so they made people travel from all over the place for miles and miles, back to their hometowns. Even mothers like Mary, who were just about to have a baby, had to listen to this rule.

#### •Read what happened next in Luke 2:6-7.

•And it was there, in Joseph's hometown of Bethlehem, that baby Jesus was born. The town was so packed that they could only manage to find shelter in the same place most people kept animals. Jesus, the savior of the world, used a manger - a feeding trough - as his crib.

#### $\circ$ Let's find out what else was going on in Luke 2:8-14.

•These shepherds have nothing to do with Jesus' story. They weren't family. They weren't even neighbors. As far as we know, these shepherds had no connections to Jesus ... yet. God made a point of sending angels to tell them of this historic moment. The angels told them that Jesus' birth would cause great joy for all people, starting with the shepherds!

#### $\circ$ What do you think the shepherds did? Let's read on in Luke 2:15-20.



•What do we do when we see or hear about something exciting? We can't wait to tell someone else about it. The shepherds were no different! They had to tell everyone! This was the beginning of the celebration to come for the world all because Jesus was born!

Reroute (Weekly challenge): Every vacation has moments of stuff... take a moment to reroute and get back to the fun. Ask do | have in my life that feels more dark and less light? Ask you bring light to the dark for you.

PRAYER: God, thank you for sending Jesus as the savior needed and still need today. Help us to step out of the closer to your light. Help this Christmas season to be can show others how much you love this world. Amen.
