


Each year, I spend time during the first couple weeks of January filling in my new calendar and realizing just how much ministry goes on at FCC. At the same time, I'm drawn to wondering what will happen in the coming year that isn't on the calendar. I often wonder if there are people in our church family who are looking for ways to get plugged in but just aren't sure where to start. With that, I decided maybe listing a few ways that you could engage in our church ministries might be helpful.

- Connect with us on You Version and do a daily Bible Study reading with us. It's a simple app to download on your computer or smart phone. I send out the invites to the Bible studies once you have set up an account and "friended" me.
- Join a Small Dinner Group they are forming right now! There are a variety of types, including eating at restaurants, potluck at the church, dining in homes and a new one which will feature weekly Bible study and dining out once a month.
- Get online on Monday evenings and join our "online Bible study." The link is posted each Monday morning on our Facebook page.
- Like and share the things we post on social media so others will know what's happening. We all have a big network of friends and by sharing the activities we are sharing the exciting things happening at FCC.
- Be a part of our Meal Ministry. We are in need of a few additional people who could be added to help deliver meals when a need arises. We deliver meals to those coming home from the hospital, families welcoming new babies, or those who have been sick at home for an extended period.
- Cookie Ministry help bake cookies once a month or help deliver cookies once a month to our homebound or someone who just needs a little extra joy brought to them.
- Bereavement Ministry When someone loses a loved one, we provide a meal for the family before or after the service. You can sign up to bring a side dish and will be contacted when the need arises; or you can sign up to come help prep and serve the meal on the day of the service.
- Kidventure Volunteers are needed to help guide students to different areas and help with pre-arranged lessons. Volunteers can also help prep and serve the snack each week (Jan. 24-March 13).
- Desserts! Our first Sunday luncheons have become a popular event. We can always use desserts for these.
- Tuesday Bible Study Wayne Elder leads a Bible Study at 6:30 p.m. in the Choir Room. They will begin a new study series on Feb. 6 titled "Women of the Bible."
- Read with a Student We have many elementary teachers in our schools and they would love to have you come volunteer and read with students once a week or once a month.
- School Support Do you have ideas for how we can support teachers at the high school each month? Let us know and/or help us put together special treats for them each month.

Those are just a handful of the things we do on a regular basis. If you are interested in being a part of any of these ministries, let me know and I will get you connected with the right person or on the list to be called when the need arises. Mark 1:14-20

In this story, we find Jesus calling four of his disciples to follow him. Their names are Simon, Andrew, James, and John. All four of these guys had the same job. **Do you remember what it was?**

That's right — they were fishers. Speaking of careers, that's a tough job! They went out every day to catch fish that they could sell to provide for their families. Some of them were in the family fishing business like James and John were with their dad, Zebedee. Jesus came and interrupted their plans because he had much better plans for them. He told them that instead of fishing for fish, they could follow him and fish for people. That meant they would go with Jesus to tell more people about God. When Jesus told them to follow him, they didn't wait, think it over for long, or let their worry about what might happen to their fishing business get in the way. They just trusted what Jesus said and followed him right away. Simon, Andrew, James, and John were among the first to become disciples of Jesus, and they did end up going out to "fish" for more people to follow Jesus, too!

SCRIPTURE QUESTIONS:

What did Simon, Andrew, James, and John all have in common? They were fishermen.

What did Jesus say to them? *To follow Jesus and become fishers of people.*

How did they respond to Jesus' call? They left everything right away and followed Jesus.

Read Psalm 62:6–7. What do these verses remind us about God? How do those things help us trust God's plans for us? God is our rock, salvation, fortress, mighty rock, and refuge. These verses remind us we can depend on God and trust God's plans.

APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

Why do you think it's important to think about the future right now?

How is following Jesus part of God's plan for you? How do you know?

What are some plans you think God might have (or you hope God has) for you?

God, thank you for having the best plans for us, especially the one where you sent Jesus to this world. Help us to trust everything you have planned for us, even when it's hard to imagine what they might be. Amen.

FCC Summer Camp 2024 — "On The Case!"



We are excited to launch our own Summer Camp in 2024. In the past, we have typically participated with our Regional Church Camp but in recent years have been dreaming of putting together a camp that is unique to our students and one that would offer a chance to build strong relationships, do service projects in our area and give them an opportunity to invite friends. Here's a little Q&A to help everyone understand the plan!

- **WHEN: Camp for 2nd-3rd graders (completed) will be July 8-10 and camp for 4th-12th (completed) will be July 8-12. All of our campers will be at the same campsite, we have just designed it so our youngest campers are only staying two nights so they can "get their feet wet" without being away from home for a full week.
- **WHERE: We will stay in the modern cabins at Central Oklahoma Camp and Conference Center. This camp is located on the southern edge of Guthrie and one that some of our older campers will be familiar with from previous camps.
- **WHAT TO EXPECT: We will have adults staying with campers throughout the week. At Camp we will have opportunities for Small Group time, meals, fun activities including swimming, fishing, canoes, paddleboats, indoor recreation and cookouts. Our 4th-12th graders will also have an opportunity to do the ropes courses, participate in offsite service projects and have a fun evening out at an event center and restaurant.
- **HOW MUCH IS IT? While we are still dialing in on the costs, expect the cost to be similar to the pricing of regional camps in previous years. For those unfamiliar, cost typically ranges around \$200/student for 2nd-3rd graders and \$350/student for the older groups.
- **FUNDRAISING: There will be multiple opportunities for students to earn money to help offset the cost. On March 3, we will have a spaghetti dinner with proceeds benefitting those who help shop, set-up, cook, serve and clean up. In May and June, junior high and high school students can volunteer at the Kiwanis Baseball Park concession stand and earn money per shift toward their camp fees. We have also been gifted boxes of Pokémon cards that will be sold at a Pokémon trading card event at the church. Students can help with those events to earn money. Dates will be coming soon for this.
- **CURRICULUM: We will be doing a curriculum that is similar to our Sunday morning and youth curriculum with some added fun. The title of the curriculum is: "On The Case!"
- **I HAVE ATHLETIC PRACTICE OR JOB AND NEED TO LEAVE CAMP OCCASIONALLY: We understand that for some Junior High and High School students, school sports practices begin in July. If your student has an athletic practice they need to attend, they can leave for practice as long as the specific days/times are turned in prior to camp and your student has transportation to and from practice. If your student has a job and needs to leave for work, they will also be allowed to leave for work purposes so long as the days/hours are turned in ahead of camp. If your student drives, you will need to fill out a permission slip for them to leave camp and drive themselves to either of these activities.
- **SIGN-UP DATE: April 1 is the deadline to reserve a spot. The initial deposit is \$25/student. The remainder will be due by May 31. We will not be able to take late sign-ups due to deadlines to reserve space at Camp.
- **WHO CAN I INVITE?: Students are welcome to invite friends who are within the age ranges of the camp they are attending. Friends will need to adhere to the deadlines for sign-up as well.
- **VOLUNTEERS: We will need a multitude of adult volunteers to make this successful. Following the April 1 deadline, we will have a better idea of how many we will need. There will be opportunities for small group leaders, meal prep, meal delivery, meal sponsorship, service project adult helpers, outdoor and indoor activity helpers, overnight volunteers to stay with students in cabins and drivers for off-site activities. Adult volunteers are not expected to be there every day and there will be opportunities to work a few hours or help a couple days; any amount of hours would be helpful!
- **GOALS: For this camp to be successful we need a minimum of seven students in each age group (2nd and 3rd graders, 4th-6th graders, 7-12th graders). If we are unable to obtain those numbers in a specific group we will not be able to host that age group this year. As always, Regional camp opportunities are available as well for each age group.
- **HOW DO I SIGN UP?? Registration forms will be available on Sunday, Feb. 4. We will have them in hard copy as well as online!
- **PRAYER: Please commit to pray for this new adventure as we embrace something new and different. Pray for those who are planning, those who will come and for our volunteers!
