


Children's Sermon in Worship

Keeping Up With Karen



As I thought through how to explain Palm Sunday to the children on Sunday for Children's Moment, I had so many thoughts about what it must have been like to be part of that moment in history. Trying to narrow down the Triumphal Entry story to a couple minutes that would make sense to children is challenging. The story is recorded in all four gospels and like most scriptures some of the gospel writers chose to put more emphasis on some things and not others.

John's account is more of a broad stroke of the scene with very little specific details (John 12:12-16), while the other three accounts give specifics about who was traveling with them; the instructions from Jesus about going to get a colt or donkey; how to handle it if someone asked what the donkey was for and whether or not people reacted to them taking the animal. The writers go on to describe the scene of people who were traveling for Passover and what they did when they saw Jesus. Some noted how the disciples put their cloaks down while others pointed out that the people waved palm branches as they passed by. (Matt. 25:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-44).

I always enjoy comparing the gospels and how the different writers captured different vantage points of what was happening at the same event. I also find it interesting how some stories are left out, while others feel certain events were important enough to include. As most of you know, I enjoy writing. It makes me wonder if I had been there to witness Jesus coming in on a donkey and the crowd's response, what would I have reported? It's no secret that I'm a detail person. I would like to think I would have described it in a way that the reader felt like they were there, recording the sights, sounds and smells. I would have wanted to reflect the excitement of the moment and yet, let readers draw their own conclusion about where they might have been if they had witnessed this same scene.

Likewise, as we go through Holy Week, I find myself reflecting on what each day actually means in my spiritual life. I don't want to take lightly the events that led to the cross. I want to spend time imagining what the disciples felt like in the Upper Room as Jesus told them someone at the table was going to betray Him. I want to think about how I would have reacted as the bread and the cup were passed to me at the table, having heard the unsettling explanation of what it represented. I want to imagine how I would have felt denying Christ, who days earlier I had proclaimed as king; and let that soak in as to how often I put my trust in Him only to fall short with worry and doubt. I want to think about those moments at the foot of the cross, watching people heave insults at Him and seeing how He reacted — humbly, assured, and determined to trust in the Father's plan. Finally, as the week comes to a close and those three days linger on, I am reminded how God works even when we aren't watching. I want to understand that He always has my best interest at heart and even when I fall short, He is faithful.

Then, on Sunday, I want to walk into our sanctuary, praising God for His gift of His one and only Son and the assurance of hope that He brought into the world. It would be so easy to skip from Palm Sunday to Easter without reflecting on the events in between; we all like to celebrate! This week, I hope that as you journey to the cross and make your way to resurrection Sunday, you spend time reflecting on all that God has done and is doing in your life and take time to share how God has changed your life.

Easter is coming! I hope to see you Sunday. God Bless you,
